I apologize because this newsletter article is going to go off the rails, (but you have all become accustomed to that in my sermons and in my previous newsletters so here I go again, nothing new) but I am in the midst of preaching my sermon for the third Sunday in May and the scripture passage is a pretty ground breaking one, one that changes the entire course of the faith in my opinion. You could say it is bigger than the gift of the Holy Spirit or you could say that it is a gigantic fruit that comes from Pentecost, but regardless, it is huge. This all takes place in Acts 10 and 11, Peter has a vision in which he understands God's plan in Jesus Christ is not just for the Israelites but for the gentiles as well. And it's funny, when I was a kid, I used to think that there were actually a nation or group of people from some country, you know like Greece or something and these people where the gentiles. I used to think, I am not a gentile, I am an American, I remember thinking that it was really nice that Peter and Paul and the Jewish community, oh and the Christian community, that they decided to let this group of people into the club, this gentile group. It is of course much much bigger than that essentially gentile meaning anyone not Jewish. Which basically means all are a part of God's plan.

We say it so plainly, John 3:16 but this was of course not always the case and no one thought any different. The language was always chosen vs outsider, clean vs unclean, righteous vs sinner. John 3:16 and the events that took place in acts 10 and 11 were unreal to the traditional law abiding Israelite. Do you ever think of the vilest of people, when you recite John 3:16, do you think of those you despise when you recall the children's song, "He's got the whole world in his hands?"

One of the best parts of Jesus was that he hung out not with religious folks but rather with the outsiders, I don't like to use the word sinners because everyone was a sinner. He hung out with those whose sin could not be hidden in the fine print, or hidden behind fancy religious garments. He hung out with those to whom the world (not God) the world had deemed unclean. Remember Jesus says the father and I are one, which means God desired to commune with the "lost" essentially. He had them in his hands, along with the rest of the world.

Some clergy these days are quick to remind those who love that Jesus did this, that he did it so as to change them. As if to say, to turn them from unclean to clean. But I don't believe that, meaning, Jesus ate with them simply because he loved them first. Jesus ate with the "unclean" not so as to make them clean but because he saw them that way already. And this shouldn't be such a taboo point of view as God tells Peter in Acts 10 and 11 essentially, "Do not call anything impure that I God have called clean." And in this vision Peter had, there ain't nothing outside of God's wide arms. Hear this friends, we have all at one point in time been a gentile, we have all at one point in time been a foreigner, we have been on the outside. Who's trying to keep us on the outside of God's grace presently? Who are we trying to keep on the outside of God's grace. Who are we judging and calling "sinner" despite knowing that truly none of us have completely laid all of our trophies down? Let us remember, we dine and commune with Christ when we accept and love those we call "sinners" to the table. To dine with them and allow for them to be the gentiles they are as we are the gentiles we are. Because we worship a God who's got big big hands and loves all us gentiles the same.

Church Finances

FINANCE TIDBITS

A few questions have been asked and I'll try to answer them and update you on a couple of other items.

Loose Offering does go to the General Fund except for the last Sunday of the month. On that Sunday it's divided between the Weiss Scholarship Fund and the PIN Fund. When you put cash into the offering plate it does not get credited to your name. This makes it difficult to track households that give or not.

Sunday School Offering goes to the General Fund.

The Church pays about \$100.00 per member to our Conference for Apportionments whether you attend church or not. Out of 218 members 112 do not give, that does include the young adults who have become members. Our Church is paying about \$11,200.00 per year to keep these non-paying members active.

I'll close with this question that I was asked. If you miss a Sunday of giving, should you make it up? My answer was does God take a Sunday Off?

You must decide in your heart how much to give. And don't give reluctantly or in response to pressure. For God loves a person who gives cheerfully. 2 Corinthians 9:7.
